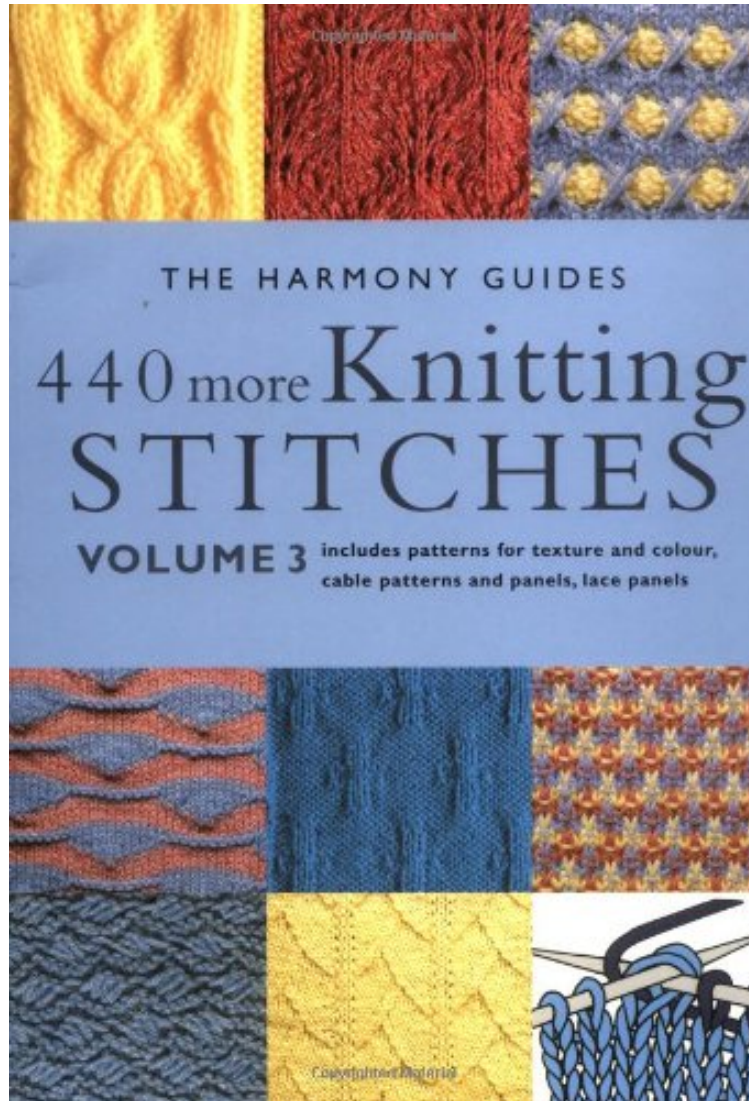

The originals were pretty worn out and scribbled over, so it's nice to have a newer set. Next to the Barbara Walker books, these are the main staples of my knitting library, and unlike the Walker books, the patterns are presented in living color.I've heard a lot of neutral reviews of the re-edited Harmony guides that have separate books for cable, lace, etc. and decided to stick with the originals because they've never disappointed. The knitted samplers can then be turned into a sampler afghan. I just received volumes 2 and 3 and love the latter for its interesting cables and lace patterns. I knit in spurts and need sampler inspirations to encourage me to complete a knitted, wearable piece. I am considered to be a 'tween knitter [beginner to intermediate]: love cables and getting the hang of lace patterns. Love the fact that I can read the abbreviated directions in this series. Have not had success in correctly reading cable or lace charts and am very daunted by Barbara Walker's charts.
